<u>Aims</u>

- To develop the self-confidence and leadership skills of pupils through a range of activities over the three year period

- 4 To support our pupils in the completion of the Duke of Edinburgh award

Year 10

The expectation is that year 10 pupils will follow a core CCF syllabus that focuses on communication, leadership and teamwork, military/adventure training and life skills as members of the Army or Navy section. This enables them to complete the volunteering section for Bronze DofE.

Some pupils may complete the Volunteering section outside of the Wednesday afternoon provision and as such may select Option 3 and could use it for their DofE Skill.
