The Paul Crosfield Choral Scholarships will be awarded to promising young singers applying to study at The Leys School, Cambridge for entry into Year 9 or Lower Sixth. The Scholars will enjoy free singing lessons and a sheet music allowance. In addition, thanks to a unique choral partnership with The Choir of Trinity College Cambridge, Paul Crosfield Choral Scholars will have the opportunity to develop their musical potential and experience singing as part of a world-renowned choir.

Paul Crosfield Choral Scholarships can be combined with other scholarships and means-tested bursaries offered by The Leys and we encourage potential applicants to contact us if they wish to discuss their individual circumstances.

The Choral Scholarships have been established in memory of Paul Crosfield. Paul was the Director of Studies at The Leys from 2010 to 2019, and a passionate enthusiast for choral music and singing.

Paul sadly died in April 2020, and the Paul Crosfield Choral Scholarships have been established through the generosity of his family, friends, former pupils and colleagues at The Leys. They will be a lasting musical memorial, to honour his life and reflect his character and interests.



A MUSICAL PARTNERSHIP

The Leys and The Choir of Trinity College Cambridge are pleased that a new choral partnership will give promising young singers the opportunity to develop their singing skills.

Paul Crosfield Choral Scholars at The Leys will be given the opportunity to:

- observe choir rehearsals and attend services regularly at Trinity College
- shadow a Trinity College Choir singer and join a rehearsal once a term
- attend concerts

In addition they will receive:

- free singing lessons
- £100 per year for the purchase of sheet music

In turn, Choral Scholars from Trinity College will have the opportunity to:

- mentor young singers
- help to lead choral workshops
- perform at The Leys

The Choral Scholars may also be awarded a full music scholarship, a music exhibition, or a means-tested bursary at The Leys.
