Role Title: School Nurse
Location: The Leys School

Key Tasks:

Nursing

- To provide a high standard of service within NMC guidelines to pupils, members of staff and any visitors while on site.
- To be accountable for all aspects of pupil's medical care including pupil in-patients.
- To ensure the provision of emergency medical care is available for all on site, i.e. pupils/staff and School visitors.
- To conduct the Nurse led Clinic on a daily basis to assess pupils and administer care and medication as required.
- To liaise with the local Doctors' surgeries and pupils' home GPs as necessary and advise parents and pupils on referrals and medication.
- To obtain necessary prescriptions and medications for pupils and arrange for hospital appointments/x ray etc.
- To arrange for transport, (someone to accompany if under 16yrs) to Doctor/hospital when required.
- To organise and carry out medical examinations for new pupils registered with the School doctor.
- To work in a safe and professional manner at all times ensuring robust procedures for best practice are in place.
- To maintain all health records accurately and confidentially, including all drugs dispensed.
- To communicate effectively with parents/guardians and with staff throughout the School.
- To arrange for any health-related appointments as requested.
- To work/liaise with external agents such as Social Services.
- Keep contemporaneous nursing records to a high standard.

Health Promotion

- Promote health education throughout the school population
- Take part in the delivery of PSHE, to support teaching staff as appropriate
- Keep up-to-date with current health promotion initiatives

General Tasks:

- To refer to and adhere to all Health and Safety procedures and policies as appropriate and other legislative requirements as required, carrying out duties by working in a safe and organised manner.
- To ensure that a safe / secure environment exists for pupils / staff and customers and meet requirements under the Health & Safety at work Act 1974 and C.O.S.H.H.

- Understand and be mindful of the School Acceptable Use Policy and Staff ICT & Social Media Guidelines.
