1. Source Analysis – Evaluating ancient texts, artefacts, or images to understand and learn about the past.
2. Interpretation – Understanding how and why different people or cultures view the same events differently; formulating your own opinions based on historical events
3. Chronology – Placing events in the correct order and understanding timelines in ancient history.
4. Cause and Consequence – Exploring why events happened and what effects they had in the ancient world.
5. Corroboration - Two sources agree on the same events happening, or the same details of an event.
6. Significance – Judging the importance of events, people, or developments in ancient history.
7. Evaluation – Assessing the usefulness of sources in learning about the ancient world.
8. Evidence – Using archaeological and written sources to support historical arguments.
9. Civilisation – Understanding the features and development of ancient civilisations like Egypt, Greece, and Rome.
10. Source – A piece of evidence about the ancient world, either a written or archaeological source.
